The Post-Covid-19 Futures Commission.




A Commission is a group of people who have been chosen to discover information about an issue.

They thought about what Scotland could look like when the pandemic is over.



1. People came together during the lockdown in spring 2020.

8. Improving our understanding is important.



The pandemic has shown us the things we need to understand better.

They are called Recommendations.


Recommendation 1



We need to listen to what changes people want to see after the pandemic.



Covid-19 has made people think about how they want Scotland to change for the better.



We should make sure that people are listened to.

We should always be looking for ways to make improvements.

Recommendation 1



The Scottish Government should do the things that were suggested by the Christie Commission.



The Scottish Government should support social prescribing.

Social prescribing is when doctors and health workers send patients to community support organisations.



Charities in Scotland should gather examples of good work together and share them.

Recommendation 2



People need to be more involved in decision making that will affect their lives.



Scotland should have a National Participation Strategy.

This would detail how people could be involved in the decision making that affects them.

The Scottish Government should set up a National Participation Centre.

This would work to create ways people can get involved in decision making.

Recommendation 3



We need to make sure we have good access to data about Scotland.



The more information we have the better decisions we can make.



We should make sure that Government and other organisations have access to information that can help them make good decisions.

Recommendation 3



The Scottish Government should begin to look at how information and data could be used and shared to help plan.

Education Scotland should create a Scottish Version of 'Let's Talk Science Canada'.



Lets Talk Science Canada is a charity in Canada.

They work to encourage young people to get interested in science.

This would look at what might happen in the future.

It would work to make sure Scotland is ready for future challenges.
